SPECIAL OLYMPICS CANADA >> WINTER GAMES 2024 <<

ON FEBRUARY 27 TO MARCH 2, 2024 the Seven Chiefs Sportsplex played host to the Special Olympic Games Calgary, 2024. February 28 marked the Floor Hockey Ceremonial Puck Drop, presented in Memory of Michael Van Ooteghem, an avid hockey fan gone too soon.

Minor Chief Tyson Heavenfire was in attendance representing Tsuut'ina, while Flames Mascot Harvey the Hound amped up the crowd, and Flames Captain, Mickael Backlund, had the honour of dropping the puck, officially opening the floor hockey competition for the Special Olympics Canada Winter Games Calgary 2024!

The 2024 Special Olympic Games cauldron has found its permanent home in the Seven Chiefs Sportsplex; a gift of legacy. Seven decorative feathers reach into the sky, pointing towards a flying eagle, whose wings create the bowl that holds the fire. The eagle - soaring high above the mountain with wings spread wide with hope - is the embodiment of dreams taking flight. The eagle also serves to highlight love in its multiple dimensions: love for all people, love of sport and its transformative power and, above all, love of the eagle itself and what it symbolizes, as a living creative set apart by the Creator to be special and empowered to soar in freedom.

Eagle's Flight will serve as a lasting reminder that love can empower people to reach new heights and achieve inspiring dreams. The seven feathers represent the Indigenous 7 Grandfather Teachings - how we should treat each other to live more inclusively and respectfully - a key principle of the Special Olympics Canada vision: to create inclusive communities. The feathers placement, in full circle surrounding the cauldron, symbolizes protection.




