





OELEBRATING TWYLLA STARLIGHT - NĀNÍYĪJTJÓNĪ!

TWYLLA JEAN STARLIGHT - BUFFALO WOMAN - is the proud daughter of Shriley Starlight and William Auger. Her Tsuut'ina name is *Xani-tii Ts'ika* which translates to 'Buffalo Woman'. Her name was given to her by the late Mike Meguinis. Her maternal grandparents are the Late Chief James Starlight "Spotted Eagle" and Mary-Jane Starlight. Her paternal grandparents are the late Alexander Makokis and Mathilda Quinn. She is strongly motivated by the teachings of her grandparents, who instilled in her to always look to the future and what we will leave our grandchildren.

Twylla grew up on the Tsuu'Tina nation being raised by her mother and grandmother and aunties and uncles. As a young girl she was well cared for and would sit closely beside her grandmother Mary-Jane who taught her how to be a strong-willed young woman. Being the oldest granddaughter, she was known as the "ringleader" and spent her childhood getting her sisters and cousins into all sorts of predicaments. Twylla did her primary education in Calgary where her strong-willed nature carried her through her education. Twylla graduated with honours from Lord Beaverbrook High School in 1988.

Following high-school, Twylla began post-secondary studies at the University of Calgary. During her second year, Twylla decided to move to Reno with her father to go to school and experience life beyond the reserve. As a young adult Twylla traveled to powwows, representing the Tsuut'ina Nation, and worked alongside her mother as a seamstress and co-owner of Tasgi Fashions.

In 1999 Twylla accidentally began her career in the Tsuut'ina Finance Department in her first role as a contract accounts payables clerk. For many years Twylla has dedicated her life, knowledge and time to Tsuut'ina Nation as a valued member of the Finance team. Twylla held numerous positions in finance over the years including file clerk, accounts payable clerk, senior accounts payable clerk, updater, information systems manager, and administration controller. In 2009 she was promoted to be












the Tsuu'tina Nation Accounting Manager and went back to school at SAIT to further her knowledge, completing the Accelerated Accounting Certificate program in 2010.









In 2017 Twylla graduated from the Southern Alberta Institute of Technology (SAIT) with her Bachelor of Applied Business Degree. It is her strong work ethics and natural intelligence that placed her with honours from SAIT, and awarded with the distinction of Phi Theta Kappa lifetime honours. In 2022 Twylla completed a Harvard Business School Certificate of Program and dedicated her success and certification to her grandmothers. Twylla's academic and professional success over the years is a representation of her unwavering commitment to her community and to creating a good life for her family.

In the winter she travels across Alberta to watch her grandchildren play hockey. In the summertime she travels with her grandchildren across Powwow Country and makes friends everywhere she goes. Twylla enjoys traveling across the world and still goes on many wild adventures. Twylla is many things: a leader, a grandma, a daughter, an accountant, a board member. In very few words, Twylla is the most kind, most dedicated and most caring person. Twylla goes above and beyond in everything that she does and always makes sure that family comes first.


