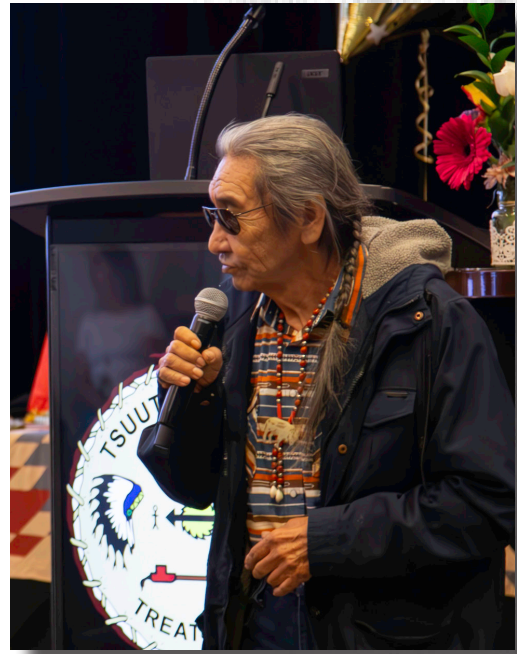


A GRAND OPENING TO REMEMBER AT THE SHOPS AT BUFFALO RUN!
