Measles is especially dangerous for babies and young children

Measles Symptoms Include:











Red, watery eyes

Why is Measles Dangerous?

Measles is highly contagious and can cause severe issues such as pneumonia, swelling of the brain (encephalitis), and death



Pneumonia occurs in 1 out of 10 cases and it is one of the most common causes of death for children under 5



Swelling of the brain occurs in 1 out of 1000 cases which can result in brain damage



Death occurs in 1-10 out of every 10 000 cases

Long Term Complications

A very rare but deadly disease called subacute sclerosing panecephalitis can occur 7 years after recovery from measles. symptoms include seizures, and mental deterioration

How to be Protected!

Immunization is the best way to protect against Measles and full protection requires two doses of the Measles vaccine
