
Imporant Information Notice for Tsúūt'ínà Citizens

Wasting Disease Present in the Area – What You Need to Know This Hunting Season



Dear Tsúūt'ínà Citizens,

As hunting season begins, it is important to be aware that Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD), has been detected in our area. This disease affects deer, elk, and moose populations and can have serious impacts on wildlife health and local ecosystems.

Protect our wildlife and treaty hunting rights by staying vigilant during hunting season.

1. Recognizing Signs of Wasting Disease

During your hunts, please watch for animals displaying the following symptoms:
