Notice to Commercial Tenants

Re: Unauthorized Alberta Separatist Activity on Tsuut'ina Nation Lands

Tsuut'ina Nation is issuing this notice to reiterate and reinforce its longstanding position regarding unauthorized political activity on Nation lands.

Tsuut'ina Nation has previously addressed incidents in which individuals associated with Alberta separatist political advocacy groups attempted to establish petition stations or related activities on Tsuut'ina Nation lands without consent. Most recently, similar activity was identified and immediately stopped. These actions do not reflect the values, priorities, or positions of the Tsuut'ina Nation.

Tsuut'ina Xàkújághá-yiná (Head Chief and Minor Chiefs) views any Alberta separatist activity as a direct challenge to the Nation's Sovereignty and Treaty Rights, and does not permit separatist booths, rallies, petitioning, or related political advocacy on Nation lands under any circumstances. This position has been clearly communicated and remains unchanged.

Taza Park and Buffalo Run are located on Tsuut'ina Nation lands, and all commercial activity within these areas must respect the Nation's governance, jurisdiction, and standards. As such, commercial tenants are strictly prohibited from permitting, facilitating, or hosting any external political advocacy, petitioning, or demonstrations on leased premises, parking areas, or adjacent commercial spaces without prior written approval from the Nation.

If individuals or groups attempt to establish political activity on site, tenants must decline permission and notify Tsuut'ina Nation Tosguna Police at 403-271-3777 so the matter can be addressed safely and appropriately. Tenants and staff should not engage with these groups, as engagement increases the risk of confrontation and unsafe situations.

Tsuut'ina Nation remains firm in protecting its lands, its people, and its inherent rights, and expects full cooperation from all commercial tenants in maintaining safety, order, and respect for Nation laws and authority.
