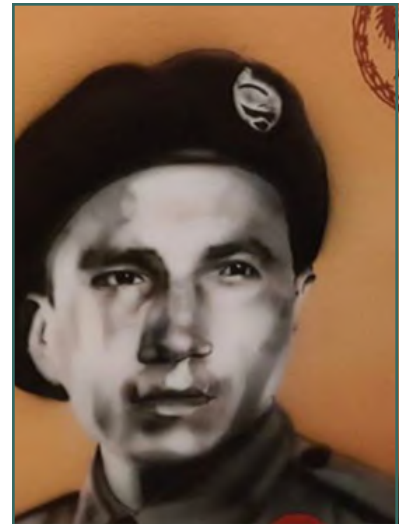


TO ALL RESIDENTS ON TSUUT'INA NATION RESERVE #145

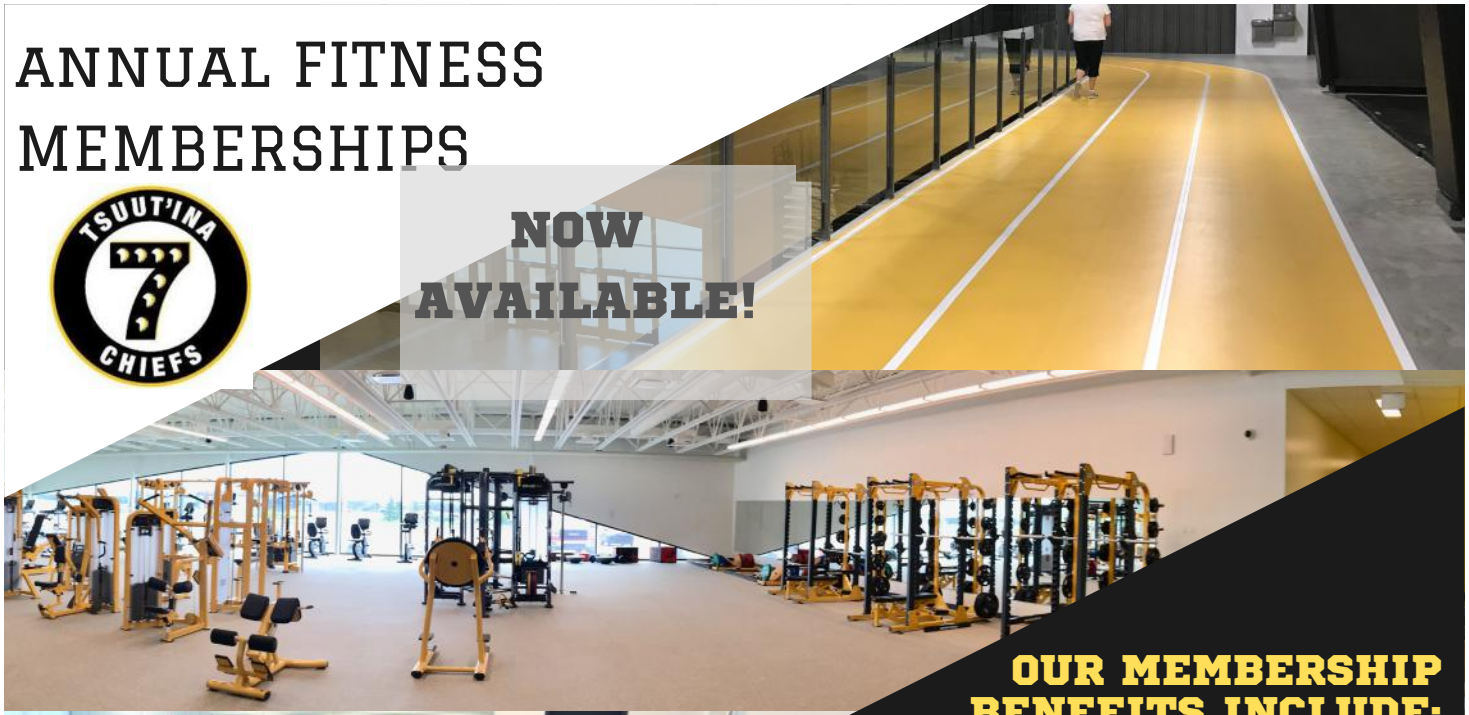

Nasal Naloxone Spray

DID YOU KNOW? That Naloxone reverses overdose from opioids

WHAT ARE OPIOIDS? Strong man-made pain killers such as Fentanyl, Heroin, Morphine, Percocet, Codeine (is in Tylenol #3)

WHAT IS NASAL NALOXONE SPRAY? The province provides Naloxone free of charge in the injectable form. However, NIHB covers Nasal Naloxone Spray which is much easier to use. You can go to a pharmacy to get Nasal Naloxone Spray **WITHOUT** a doctor's prescription.

HOW DOES NASAL NALOXONE SPRAY WORK? The spray is absorbed in the tissues of the nostrils. A person does not need to be breathing for the spray to work.

WHERE CAN YOU GET NASAL NALOXONE SPRAY?

- Tsuut'ina Pharmacy stocks the Nasal Naloxone Spray: **403 251 6700**
- Cedarbrae Pharmacy stocks the Nasal Naloxone Spray: **403 238 0860**
- Woodbine Shopper's Drug Mart will order the spray in for you. If the demand increases they will start to stock it regularly: **403 281 1616**
- Merit IDA in Braeside will order the spray in for you. If the demand increases they will start to stock it regularly: **403 255 0049**

WHO IS MOST VULNERABLE TO OVERDOSE? People coming out of periods of abstinence because the tolerance for the substance goes down quickly:

- People coming out of **abstinence-based treatment centres**
- People recently **incarcerated**
- People recently **hospitalized**
- People who are trying to quit the substance and are **not on Opioid Substitution Therapy** such as Suboxone or Methadone
- People **coming off of Opioid Substitution Therapy**

ARE YOU CURIOUS ABOUT OPIOID SUBSTITUTION THERAPY? The lowest barrier option to date that we know of for the Nation is the **Virtual Opioid Substitution Clinic**. They can discuss options with you over the phone and can arrange for your prescription to be sent to the pharmacy of your choice: **1 844 383 7688**.

These are all **CONFIDENTIAL** options available to people with **no moral or legal consequences**. It is illegal to share health information without your written and informed consent. NIHB is not tracking people in terms of who is getting Naloxone Kits.

CITIZEN DECLARATION

*We, The Tsuut'ina of the Dene, The First People of this Land Continue to Acknowledge:
Our Nation's Future Generations, The Natural Laws Embodied in Our Language,
The Tsuut'ina Way of Life
As Children of Nature, And Stewards of the Land Which Has Been Entrusted to Tsuut'ina.*

CONSTITUTION DECLARATION

We, the Citizens of the Tsuut'ina Nation, under the guidance of Nataa, hereby ordain, adopt and proclaim this Constitution to secure and preserve the Tsuut'ina way of life. Nataa put us here, the Tsuut'ina, and gave us a place on Earth to provide for our needs so that we may live and prosper.

Through this Constitution and succeeding laws, the Tsuut'ina Nation safeguards our lands, language, culture, traditions and distinct identity; which will ensure safety, health, liberty, prosperity, equality, and justice for all Tsuut'ina Citizens. We hereby work to build an economy through our common resources for the Tsuut'ina Nation collective to provide an opportunity for Tsuut'ina Citizens.

Tsuut'ina Nation perpetuates our existence by accepting stewardship of lands and resources, ensuring the use and benefit for the Tsuut'ina for the generation to come. Our inherent and Treaty rights are the basis for our governance, social, cultural, and economic systems.

We practice these rights, responsibilities, and sacred obligations from generation to generation as long as the sun shines, grass grows, rivers flow, and the wind blows. We have been autonomous and connected to our traditional and settled the lands since time immemorial;

This is confirmed by our oral history, our Elders teachings, our traditions, our ceremonies, and customary practices.

The Tsuut'ina Nation, through this Constitution, retains and asserts inherent sovereign and Treaty rights as expressed and exercised by our ancestors in trade and Treaty negotiations.

LAND AND ENVIRONMENT PRINCIPLES FOR CITIZEN INPUT AND ENGAGEMENT

Land and Environment Principles 1-3

1. *Tsuut'ina Nation Lands have been set apart for the use and benefit of the Tsuut'ina Nation. Any additional lands that may be acquired by the Tsuut'ina Nation shall likewise be for the use and benefit of the Tsuut'ina Nation.*
2. *Tsuut'ina Nation Lands are held collectively by the Citizens of the Tsuut'ina Nation. No individual Citizen owns land. The Tsuut'ina Nation does not issue Certificates of Possession to individual Citizens.*
3. *Tsuut'ina Lands are a valuable resource and must be protected. The Tsuut'ina Nation way of life is to maintain harmony between Citizens and their environment; to enforce and preserve and protect the lands, air, water, ora and fauna, ecological systems, natural resources, historic and cultural artifacts and archaeological sites; and to create and maintain conditions under which Citizens and nature may co-exist fulfilling the land, environment, water, cultural protocols, social, economic, notwithstanding any other requirements for the benefit all generations of the Tsuut'ina Nation in perpetuity.*



TSUUT'INA NATION GOVERNANCE AND LANDS ADMINISTRATION PORTFOLIOS

LAND AND ENVIRONMENT PRINCIPLES FOR CITIZEN INPUT AND ENGAGEMENT

Land and Environment Principles 4-7

4. *Certain Tsuut'ina Nation Citizens have been allocated land for their use. These Citizens are responsible to mitigate and remedy all environmental concerns as approved by Tsuut'ina Chief and Council and through individual efforts as trustee of the environment and land use for succeeding generations. This means care-taking the lands to attain the widest range of beneficial uses of the environment without degradation, risk to health or safety or other undesirable and unintended consequences.*

5. *A Tsuut'ina Nation Citizen who has been allocated land must apply for leases and permits for use of allocated land and fulfill all requirements of said process.*

6. *All Tsuut'ina Citizens are to respect land allocations while using lands, for residency, community use, economic development while not causing harm, hardship or trespassing through allocated lands.*

7. *The authority to designate, surrender, separate, or dispose of land for future development for the benefit of the Tsuut'ina Nation belongs exclusively to the Tsuut'ina Electorate to be decided on by a Referendum.*

Tsuut'ina citizens will be provided with Information materials to explain land and Environmental principles terminology.



TSUUT'INA NATION GOVERNANCE AND LANDS ADMINISTRATION PORTFOLIOS

LAND AND ENVIRONMENT PRINCIPLES FOR CITIZEN INPUT AND ENGAGEMENT

Land and Environment Principles 8-11

8. *A Tsuut'ina Nation Citizen who has reached the age of 18 is entitled to receive land allocation for a house site through generational land allocation. Only in extreme circumstances will a Tsuut'ina Nation Citizen be approved a land allocation through the general lands inventory.*
9. *All development on Tsuut'ina Nation Lands, such as water developments, farms, homes and businesses, shall be subject to laws and policy to protect the collective interests.*
10. *Tsuut'ina Government may take possession of land for the beneficial use of the Tsuut'ina Nation provided that any Citizen deprived of a previously authorized legal use will be compensated utilizing the established base line formula applied for the Ring Road Agreement that also includes a nuisance fee.*
11. *In the event of death, the Executor of the deceased person's land use occupation will present the wishes of the deceased to Chief and Council who will have final approval.*

Approve the Land Board Mandate: to develop the law, regulations, policy, procedures, structure and guidance for the administration of Tsuut'ina Nation Lands, to be approved pursuant to the Tsuut'ina Nation Legislative Process Act.
