"When Joe Big Plume, Chief of the Sarcees entertains the members of his band for the tribal feast the day following Christmas, he does not let a little thing like numbers cramp his style. He is likely to have at least 160 guests, a score of teams- and an equal number of dogs. His residence is a four-room cottage but somehow or other the whole tribe congregates beneath its roof."

"...Their own thanks, were later expressed by Chief Big Plume, who told the assembly "these gifts for our children come from the children of our own Chief Spotted Eagle, Lord Baden Powell, and Otter Woman who is a great woman of our tribe. Their children, the Scouts and Guides, are our brothers and sisters and we thank them for remembering us and send back our greetings to these kind people and their children."

7. *No later than fourteen (14) calendar days before a Distribution or Dividend Payment, the Tsuut'ina parents or guardians must of a Minor shall sign a completed Confirmation Form, in the form attached as Appendix "A" confirming they have care and custody of the Minor.*
13. *No later than fourteen (14) calendar days before Distribution or Dividend Payment, the Tsuut'ina parent or guardian to receive the Per Capita Distribution or Dividend Payment on behalf of the Minor must sign a Statutory Declaration, in the form attached as Appendix "B", confirming that he or she will be receiving funds on behalf oh the Minor and that the funds will be used only for the benefit of the Minor, or will be deposited in a trust account maintained for the Minor.*

West Glacier, MT Artists are encouraged to apply for the 2020 Glacier National Park Residence Program. The application period will be open November 6, 2019 January 6, 2020

The residence program offers artists focused time to creatively explore the park's numerous and varied natural and cultural resources, and to share their work through educational programs.

Each session will run for four weeks during June, July, and September. The sessions offer artists uninterrupted time to pursue their artistic discipline and a furnished house located in the park.

Those selected are required to present several public programs during their residency. The programs must be related to their experience as an artist residence and can be demonstrations, workshops, exploratory walks, or performances.

As part of Glacier's 2020 Artist Residence Program, our friends in [Waterton Lakes National Park](#) invite successful candidates to visit [Waterton Lakes National Park](#) to connect the two parks as the world's first International Peace Park (1932) and [UNESCO World Heritage Site](#). The trip to WLNP will consist of a tour of Waterton as well as a workshop presentation similar to the one in Glacier National Park.
