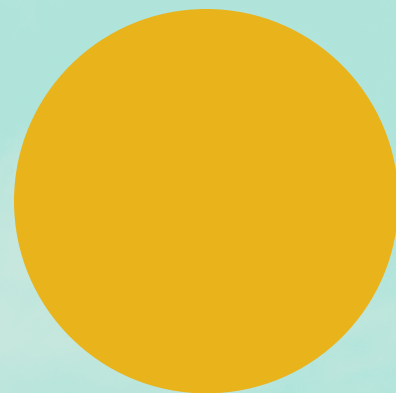

TSUT'INA NATION INHERENT & TREATY RIGHTS

Tsut'ina Nation acknowledges and declares that our lands and Inherent Rights are given to our peoples by Nata (the Creator). Our Treaty Rights are affirmed as international law, entered into as sacred agreements with Her Majesty the Queen. No colonial institution, external government, federal authority, provincial authority, or municipal authority supersedes our sovereignty and jurisdiction over our lands, peoples, governance, or way of life. Treaties 6, 7, and 8, and the 48 First Nations within those Treaty lands, existed prior to the creation of the Province of Alberta. We will continue to assert our sovereignty regardless of any Alberta referendum outcome, as no referendum can supersede the Treaty and Inherent Rights of the Treaties 6, 7, and 8 Rights holders.

ALBERTA REFERENDUM VOTE INFORMATION

If you choose to Vote in the Referendum Process

We, as Treaty Peoples, made our Treaty with the Crown of Great Britain and Ireland and not with the state of Canada or the Province. We respect people's individual choice to vote or not to participate in this provincial process. For those who choose to vote and participate in this process will have this information is provided to ensure your voice is heard.

This information is to assist in understanding how the vote will work, what is needed to vote, and what questions will be asked.

What is being voted on?

There will be **ten (10)** referendum questions on separate, numbered and color-coded ballots.

Questions 1-9 are YES/NO. Question 10 is a choice between two options.

IMPORTANT:

QUESTION TEN (10) does not directly decide that Alberta will separate from Canada. This question asks whether the Government of Alberta should begin the legal process required to hold a future binding provincial referendum on whether Alberta should separate from Canada.

Separation question asked:

"Should Alberta remain a province of Canada, or should the Government of Alberta commence the legal process required under the Canadian Constitution to hold a binding provincial referendum on whether or not Alberta should separate from Canada?"

OPTION ONE (1) – Alberta should remain a province of Canada.

OPTION TWO (2) – The Government of Alberta should commence the legal process required under the Canadian Constitution to hold a binding provincial referendum on whether or not Alberta should separate from Canada.

What do you need to Vote?

One (1) Piece of Alberta Issued Photo ID: Alberta Licence or Alberta ID
OR

Two (2) Pieces ID both with name and one showing current address (NO PO box address will be accepted) – If Citizens have no ID with their clear address on it, they may utilize billed mail with full name on it OR attestation form filled out.

Where can you Vote?
