Tsuut'ina First Nations, one of the Nations of Treaty # 7, stand in solidarity with the other First Nations of Treaty #6, Treaty #7 and Treaty #8 territories that the province of Alberta resides on.

No province in Canada has the legal authority to alter, diminish, or extinguish Treaty Rights or the constitutional relationship between First Nations and the Imperial Crown. This relationship predates the creation of the province of Alberta.

The Tsuut'ina First Nations stress the importance of stability and respectful government-to-government discourse at a time when rising and increasing social tensions, misinformation, and political division has overshadowed the province as it moves towards holding the Alberta referendum 2026 vote on October 19, 2026.

First Nations in Treaty #6, Treaty #7 and Treaty #8 territories have made it clear that they will continue to stand up for the Treaty and constitutionally-protected rights of First Nations and all people in Alberta.

Our Nation is a partner in the creation of all of Canada with the Imperial Crown, including, the creation of the Province of Alberta in 1905. We stand to protect our political structure and relations with both Canada and Alberta. They will never be separated. Separatists are not the voice of Alberta. They are confused and led by a monster that will abandon them.
